








Thursday, September 21, 2017



It's listed for sale **here on craigslist** and was sent in to us by reader Clarke B., who must share my sense of the absurd. It's located in Tecumseh, Michigan and is priced at \$20,000.





The Cabillista (Spanish for horseman/horsewoman) is very much a product of its time. Between 1977 and 1982, a customizer by the name of Les Dunham and his Dunham Coach Works (which apparently is **still in business**) customized approximately 50 C3 Corvettes into Cabillistas, which then were sold for \$50-60,000 new.
